



In December, I attended a meeting of the St. Mary's County Commissioners and watched as they unanimously voted to grant the Friends of the Library (FOL) a three-year lease for our book sorting room in what is now the Board of Elections. We pay \$1 a year rent, and have the possibility of two one-year extensions.

I thanked them then. I wrote to thank them, and I am using this opportunity to thank them yet again. It was a friendly session, whereas the previous slate of commissioners had not been so well-disposed to the library or the FOL.

Thus the budget of our county library has fallen well behind the budgets of the libraries of the (far less literate!) counties of Charles and Calvert. Rising minimum wages in Maryland, the rising cost of books, furniture, utilities etc., as well as the competitive job market and a nearly 40% turnover in library staff over the past 2 years, mean the library needs a large increase to its budget for fiscal year 2024.

The library is requesting additional funding to pay for a salary scale adjustment for its wonderful, dedicated staff and four new positions that will help keep our libraries open the current hours, continue to offer an amazing collection of both print and digital items, get the new Mobile Library out on the road, and continue to provide excellent programs and events for all ages, free of charge.

So, I am asking ALL OUR MEMBERS please to drop the commissioners a line (letter, postcard, email...) asking them to support the library's fiscal '24 budget request. Or just tell them how much the library means to you. Mail letters to Commissioners of St. Mary's County, Post Office Box 653, Leonardtown, Maryland 20650 or email all the commissioners at csmc@stmaryscountymd.gov.

Speaking of money, the FOL netted a record \$7,500 from its December book sale. Thank you.

And hoping for even more money, we have scheduled our Spring Sale at the Fairgrounds for April 14-15-16. You know the drill: members only on Friday but you can renew/join at the door. Or, avoid the crowd and join online at Friends of the St. Mary's County Library - Join or Renew (wildapricot.org) (We now have over 500 members, another record!)

The only complaint the Commissioners had about the Friends (and this was jovial) was that we encouraged them to buy too many books at our sales. So be like a commissioner and come out and buy too many books. And please keep buying on-line.

But Where Does All That Money Go?!

Almost all the money raised through FOL sales and dues goes to the library. Our overheads are low. Our annual dinner and brunch generally just about break even. In the past we have even persuaded volunteers (many with trucks) to manage the back-breaking task of moving books to the Fairgrounds and setting them up. This year, due to scheduling complexities, we'll be using a moving company.

FOL donations helped furnish the new Leonardtown Library and refurnish the Lexington Park branch.

Since then, we have settled down to funding ongoing expenses and other items. In 2022, for example, we put in \$40,000 for Hoopla Digital (ebooks, audiobooks, streaming movies and music). Our money purchased a new server for hosting the library network (\$21,513.55) and provided additional funds to upgrade the print collection to Radio Frequency Identification (RFID) checkout, in which you simply lay your books on a checkout platform (\$7,993.77).

"There are other small expenses, but those are the major ones," said library director Michael Blackwell. "They have been essential for providing content, making sure our network is safe and reliable and our materials circulate in the most economic and efficient way."



Hello Friends.

I typically like to use the space I am so graciously allotted tell you about all the great things that are happening at your St. Mary's County Library. Many fun new programs are in fact happening, and circulation is getting back up to pre-pandemic levels. Our meeting and study rooms have never been busier. Unfortunately, I'm compelled to write about a more troubling topic.

For many years, library funding has lagged behind that of many other county entities. For example, if one factors in all the cost-of-living and merit increases that have been given to county employees and to library employees—incidentally, we are not officially either county or state employees—we lag seriously behind. Since 2015, county employee rates of pay have risen 59%. Library employee rates have risen 31%--a little more than half. The library is funded in part with state money. Each year, on average, we get about \$30,000 more from the state. All increases are of course gratefully accepted. But the state increases have not been enough for us to match county amounts, especially since we must also plan for cost increases in utilities, furnishings, computer and network equipment, with large increases for materials, especially digital materials. If we didn't have your wonderful support, in fact, we wouldn't be able to offer one of our most popular digital platforms, Hoopla.

Given rising costs, especially in the past year, we are no longer able to offer as much in materials and programming as we once were. The same amount of money no longer goes as far.

We are therefore making a large budget request to the county commissioners this year. We are asking for an additional \$1.3 million—about a 40% increase.

That percentage is certainly large. But that amount doesn't quite make up the funding gap that has arisen in salaries alone. And we wish to provide more materials and programs, and not simply pay better—though we have seen 40% staff turnover in the last year. Our employees love working at the library, but it is hard for many to stay when our starting frontline salaries are less per hour than what McDonald's is paying.

This is where you come in. I hope that you will draft a letter to our commissioners asking that the library request be fully funded. It doesn't have to be a long letter. You can simply make the basic request to fully fund us and then give an example or two of how the library helps you or the community. Please be respectful and positive. We are not in an adversarial relationship with our county. They have many more requests for funding than money to give and have difficult choices to make. We respect their situation. We simply hope to catch up for some years in which we were not given what would have funded the library services that you want and deserve.

Thank you for considering our request and for your support of St. Mary's County Library and of our wonderful Friends!

Book Recommendation for Nonfiction Lovers

"The Warmth of Other Suns" by Isabel Wilkerson

ISBN 9780679444329. Published by Penguin Random House, copyright 2011.

This book is a history of the Great Migration of Black southerners who migrated from former Confederate States from 1915 to 1970s.

Its author is a Pulitzer Prize winning journalists whose parents were part of the Great Migration. She interviewed over 1000 Black southerners who left the south and relocated in Northern, Midwest and Western States, and selected three to tell their stories. One migrated from Louisiana to California, one from Mississippi to Chicago and one from Florida to Harlem. In addition to telling their stories, the author describes the conditions that the migrants left and what they experienced in their new locations over their lifetimes.

FOL Brunch a Huge Success!

The St. Mary's County Friends of the Library held its Annual Winter Brunch January 21 at St. Andrew's Church in California, MD.

Opening remarks were given by FOL Vice-President Rebecca Vanecko who proudly reported that membership now stands at 500 – a new record.

She introduced Guest Speaker Calvert Marine Museum Curator of Paleontology Stephen Godfrey, who held his audience transfixed during his talk on fossils.

Godfrey believes each fossil tells a story, and he refers to himself as a forensic paleontologist.

He described how scientists use the width of a fossil shark tooth to calculate the size of the shark it came from; a 5-inch tooth means that it came from a 50-foot shark.

He mentioned that February 22 is Universal Coprolite Day and he displayed an actual coprolite sample. (This year, however, the celebration takes place on February 20, which is –coincidentally - also Presidents' Day.) Coprolites are fossilized poop of animals that lived millions of years ago. They are known as trace fossils as opposed to body fossils, meaning *not* the animal's actual body.



What's Cooking

Mother Pectol's Crab Dip Recipe

FOL Treasurer, Louie Pectol, shares a treasured family favorite recipe.

Ingredients:

8 oz Cream Cheese

I TBSP Sour Cream

I TBSP Milk

1/4 tsp Cayenne Pepper

2 TBSP Dry Sherry

2 TBSP Finely Grated Onion

5 oz Crab Meat

Directions:

Mix all of the above together. Gently fold in 5 ounces of crab meat. Cover with parmesan cheese.

Bake in a preheated 350 degree oven for 30 minutes.

Serve with crackers or scoop style Fritos.

Louie's notes:

- 1. I always make a double batch. For a double batch, I use 15 oz. crab meat. I don't use the more expensive lump crabmeat, just the kind that has the claw and regular crab meat mixed together.
- 2. Light sour cream is fine but I have had mixed results using the light cream cheese it can make the dip too runny. Also, don't use whipped cream cheese, again it bakes up too runny.
- 3. If you are transporting the dip to a party, you can make it ahead and transport unbaked. If you do this, add the parmesan cheese just before you put it in the oven.
